

MCCULLOCH STREET LOCAL AREA TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT PLAN



PROPOSED TRAFFIC CALMING MEASURES FOR MCCULLOCH STREET, CURTIN

The ACT Government is proposing to implement traffic calming measures for McCulloch Street in Curtin in response to feedback from the community. These measures will address resident's concerns over the potential increase in through traffic in McCulloch Street due to the Molonglo development.

Roads ACT met with local residents in July and November 2011 to explore a number of options to improve safety in the area. The preferred option is shown on the attached map and is now available for public comment.

Proposed changes

The proposed changes for McCulloch Street include:

- speed cushions on approaches to roundabouts;
- raised platforms with a marked pedestrian crossing;
- reduced speed limit of 50 kilometres an hour;
- new arrangement at the intersection of McCulloch Street and Dunstan Street;
- associated signage; and
- on street parking.
