

Reduce your speed... it's a safety issue.

Speeding is a major problem in the ACT

Nearly half the motor vehicle crashes in the ACT are rear-enders. This means motorists are travelling too quickly and too close to the car in front.

As shown in recent road safety television advertisements, no matter how good a driver you are, if something unexpected happens, the speed you are travelling will largely determine the outcome of what happens next.

Speed cameras have been shown to be an effective way of reducing speeding and improving safety. Speed camera vans are allocated to sites solely on road safety grounds.

You need to be aware that speed camera vans can monitor your speed in a number of ways. The cameras can be pointed out the front of the van, or the back. They can also monitor traffic travelling in the opposite direction, across all lanes, day or night and in all weather conditions.

Last year speed camera vans checked the speeds of over 2.3 million vehicles. Around half of one percent, or over 11,000 vehicles, were speeding. Speed camera vans are there to detect and deter speeding drivers who place their life, your life, and the lives of others, at risk.
